



The Entry must be completed during the current school year. • Entry must be two dimensional. • Entry must be on canvas or paper. • Canvas entries must be submitted on a stretcher frame or canvas board. • Paper entries must be reinforced with heavy paper. • Do not frame art with wood, metal, plastic or glass. • Mats may be used, including mounted and floating mats. • Entries may not be smaller than 8"x10" and not larger than 18"x24" including mat. • Acrylic, chalk, crayon, ink, aprker, pastel, pen, pencil, tempera, watercolor, glitter or other media may be used. • If the American Flag is used, it does not need conform to the Federal Flag Code in relation to colors, numbers of stars and stripes and other pertinent rules of the code. • Coloring sheets, digital art and photography are not accepted. • Completed typed or printed legible entry form including parent and/or guardian signatures. • Students name, age and grade level must be printed on back of art entry.
