Governor Ferguson Confirms Commitment to Preventing Suicide Among Washington's Service Members, Veterans, and Their Families through Governor's Challenge

OLYMPIA – Washington State Governor Bob Ferguson recently signed a proclamation renewing the state's dedication to the Governor's Challenge to Prevent Suicide Among Service Members, Veterans, and Their Families (SMVF). This initiative, in partnership with the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), unites all 50 states and five territories in a collaborative effort to implement comprehensive suicide prevention strategies for SMVF.

"We need the help of all Washingtonians and I urge everybody to raise awareness of the support services that are available for suicide prevention," said Gov. Ferguson during the proclamation signing. "I urge all people in our state to raise awareness of behavioral health, suicide prevention, lethal means safety, and the support services available in our communities. Together we must encourage those in need to reach out for help, hope, and community"

The Governor's Challenge has three focused priority areas:

- ✓ Identifying SMVF and Screening for Suicide Risk
- Promoting Connectedness and Improving Care Transitions

Celebrating Patriotic Holidays

Patriotic holidays are an opportunity time to involve the whole family and bring community attention to your Auxiliary. When fun family events are presented to the community, prospective new members will walk through your door. Patriotic holidays can serve as the perfect way to show that your Auxiliary supports patriotism, veterans and their families as a top priority.

Star Family Recognition

You may have seen a blue star, gold star or silver star service flag or service banner in the window of a home in your area. A service flag or service banner is a banner approved by the Secretary of Defense that family members of those serving in the United States Armed Forces can display.

- Blue Star Families can display a flag or banner with a white field and a red border, with a blue star for each family member serving in the United States Armed Forces during any period of war or hostilities.
- Gold Star Families can display a flag or banner with a white field and a red border, with a gold star that represents a family member who died during military operations.
- Silver Star Families can display a flag or banner with a blue field with an outer red and inner white border, with a silver star that represents a family member who was injured, wounded or became ill during or as a result of combat. You are encouraged to recognize and honor these families in your community.*

Some things we can do are:

Display your American Flag at home and place small American Flags throughout your neighborhood to boost morale. **Don't forget the 4th of July!**

Phone a friend. So many of us rely on texting to communicate and while it's a great way to check in, the sound of another's voice can bring comfort to another person that a text can't. For those who are alone and sheltering at home, a phone call may be the only contact they have with the outside world. Spare a few minutes, pick up the phone and make someone's day! Donate food or money to a food pantry, or take a meal to a shut-in or person in need.

Put up signs on lawns, windows or doors to say "Thank You" to our first responders.
