

The Meaning of the Stars for Gold Star Families:

- A. **Blue Star** A family member is serving on active duty
- B. Silver Star A family member was wounded or injured in a war zone
- C. **Gold Star** A family member was killed in action while serving our country

The **Gold Star** represents the highest price of freedom — the life of a loved one. These families carry both profound grief and immense pride in their hero's service and sacrifice.

These signs require immediate attention. If you are experiencing any of these and need medical attention, call 911 now. For immediate help in dealing with a suicidal crisis, contact the Veterans Crisis Line: Dial 988 then Press 1.

- ✓ Thinking about hurting or killing yourself
- ✓ Looking for ways to kill yourself
- ✓ Talking about death, dying, or suicide
- ✓ Self-destructive behavior, such as drug abuse, risky use of weapons, etc
